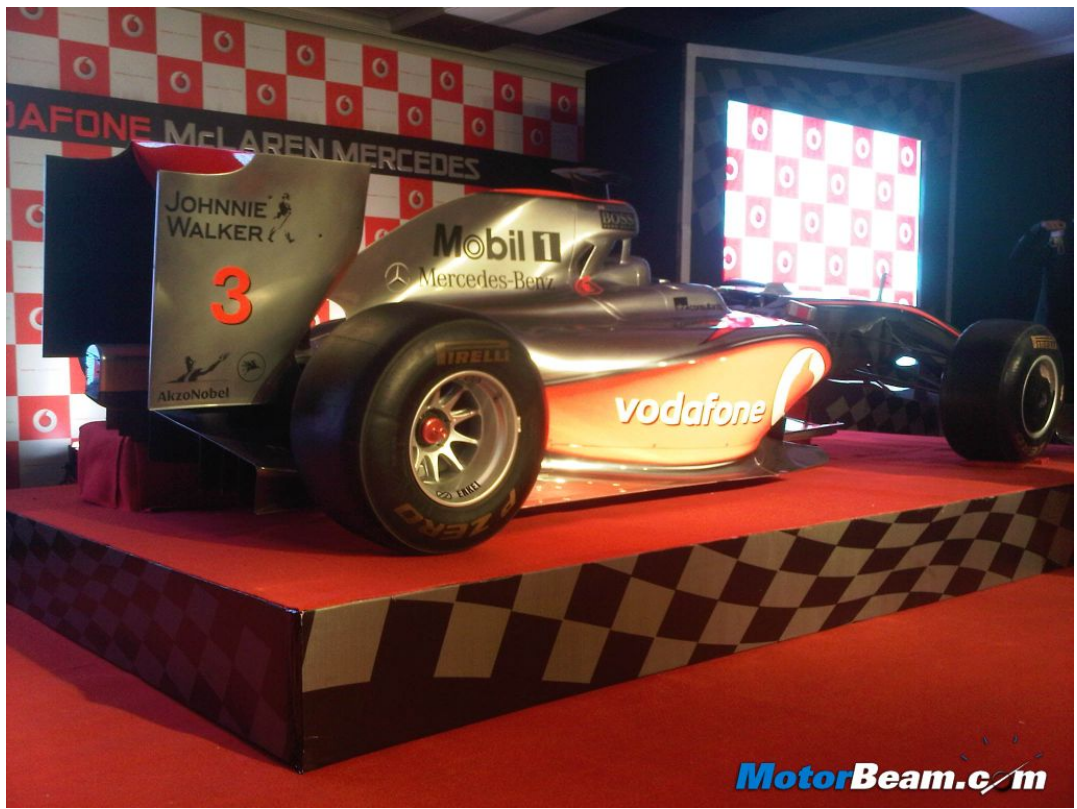
# McLaren Drivers Excited About Indian GP
